


#### Equine Highlights


- ✓ There were an estimated 168,000 equine of all types in New York
- ✓ All light horse breeds combined totaled 142,500
- ✓ Draft horse breeds increased from 7,200 head in 1988 to 11,500 in 2000
- $\checkmark$  The number of ponies dropped 68 percent to a total of 11,500 in 2000
- ✓ The value of all equine in New York on September 1, 2000, is \$1.70 billion
- ✓ Total equine-related assets were \$6.15 billion
- ✓ The value of land, fences and buildings accounted for \$3.71 billion
- ✓ Equine owners and operators spent a total of about \$523 million for operating expenses and expenditures for capital items totaled \$181 million
- ✓ Total expenses per equine on hand September 1, 2000 averaged \$4,188
- ✓ A total of 11,200 hired workers were employed on New York equine operations during 2000

#### Equine By Breed



Light breeds excluding racing breeds totaled 100,500 head or 60 percent of the total. Racing breeds totaled 42,000 or 25 percent of the total equine in New York.


## Operations By Type



Almost half of the operators, 49 percent, describe their equine operation as non-commercial/non-farm.


## Equine By Primary Use






The leading use in 2000 was equine used for pleasure. Equine used for breeding was second followed closely by equine used for competition or sport (excluding thoroughbred or standardbred racing).

#### Operating Expenses




Operating expenses totaled \$523 million. The leading operating expenses were for feed and bedding at \$119.5 million and hired labor at \$88.3 million.




Equine related assets totaled \$6.15 billion. Land and buildings totaled \$3.71 billion and equine on hand was \$1.70 billion.

#### Light Horse Breeds



Quarter Horses led all light breeds, with 29,600 head, a 38 percent increase from 1988.
